WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 16-52000 adopted by the Township on May 9, 2000 ("Ordinance 16-52000"), the Township granted a franchise to the City of Big Rapids (the "Franchise") and gave the City the right and privilege, for a period of thirty (30) years, to construct, install, maintain, operate, repair, replace, and remove public water mains, pipes, fittings, valves, meters, pumps and all other necessary equipment and appurtenances (together comprising the "Water System"), including the right to construct, install, and maintain the several components of the Water System on, along across and under the public highways, streets, alleys and other public places in the Township; and WHEREAS, the City desires to extend its Water System through the Township as proposed on the plans and specifications attached hereto as Attachment A or, alternatively, to install a new water plant to service the Gotion plant as proposed on the plans and specifications attached hereto as Exhibit B; and WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance 16-52000, the Township is required by resolution to review and approve the plans and specifications for all proposed extensions of the City Water System within the Township; provided, however, that in accordance with Ordinance 16-52000 the Township's review and

WHEREAS, the Township Board of the Charter Township of Green (the "Township Board") has reviewed the two alternative sets of plans and specifications for the proposed extension of the Water System. NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

approval in these circumstances is limited to the impact, if any, such extension may have on the orderly

development of the Township consistent with the Township Master Plan; and

The Township Board hereby approves both sets of plans and specifications for the proposed extensions of the Water System as shown in Attachments A and B hereto, with the understanding that the City may select, at its sole discretion, the option that is most feasible and convenient based on the circumstances and results of its efforts to obtain other required outside approvals.

The Township Board, in approving the plans and specifications finds and determines that neither of the two alternative proposed extensions of the Water System will adversely impact the orderly development of the Township consistent with the Township's Master Plan.

The components of either proposed extension to the Water System shall be considered installed at the expense of the City, shall be owned by the City, and shall not be subject to reversion to the Township following the termination, revocation or expiration of the City's Franchise.

All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith shall be in the same are hereby rescinded.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO THE MUTUAL FIRE PROTECTION CONTRACT WITH CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF GREEN

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT is made as of the 10th day of October 2023, by and between the City of Big Rapids, a municipal corporation, of Big Rapids, Michigan, hereinafter referred to as the CITY, and the Charter Township of Green, Mecosta County, Michigan, hereinafter referred to as the TOWNSHIP.

WHEREAS, the City and Township entered into a "Mutual Fire Protection Contract" dated February 9, 2021 (See Attached Contract); and,

WHEREAS, with the possible location of a large manufacturing plant in the Township (hereafter referred to as "the Gotion Plant") and other likely commercial and industrial expansion, the parties agree to amend the existing contract as follows:

WITNESSETH

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Paragraph 5 is added as follows:

The Gotion Plant is not expected to be subject to property taxes for a period of time pursuant to various State, County and Township tax abatements. During the period that the Gotion Plant is not subject to Township mileage, the City will not be paid the equivalent of 1 mil on the value of the Gotion Plant. Instead Gotion or its successor(s) will pay to the Township \$160,000 in March of 2024 and \$175,000 in March of 2025. These two payments will immediately be paid to the City.

The Mutual Fire Protection Contract ends on March 31, 2026. A new contract is expected to be negotiated at that time.

This fee paid by Gotion or its successors is in addition to the Township annually paying 1 mil of their taxable value plus \$5,000 as provided in Paragraph 1 of the original Contract.

Paragraph 6 is added as follows:

This additional funding provided in Paragraph 5 is regarding new and updated equipment, other capital needs, training, personnel costs, building improvements, administration expenses and additional call volumes as the result of the Gotion Plant.

 All of the other terms of the Mutual Fire Protection Contract dated February 9, 2021 remain the same.
