## **NEW PATHOLOGIST HIRED**

# **OLD BUSINESS**

#### **PEDESTRIAN BRIDGE**

Results of two separate samples are 2700 parts/million and 0900 parts/million under the recommended 5000parts/million. No action was taken at this time.

Section 1.		•	Prohibited. The establishment and/or opera	

Initiated Law 1 of 2018, commonly known as the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act,

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is prohibited throughout the jurisdictional boundaries of Green Township. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, the following types of marihuana establishments:

- A. Marihuana grower.
- B. Marihuana safety compliance facility.
- C. Marihuana processor.
- D. Marihuana microbusiness.
- E. Marihuana retailer.
- F. Marihuana secure transporter.
- G. Any other type of marihuana-related business that is subject to licensing by the state department of licensing and regulatory affairs ("LARA") under Michigan Initiated Law 1 of 2018 or the rules promulgated thereunder.
- **Section 2. Rights Under MMMA Not Impaired**. This Ordinance does not limit any privileges, rights, immunities or defenses of a person as provided in the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, Michigan Initiated Law 1 of 2008, MCL 333.26421, *et seq*.
- **Section 3.** Transportation of Marihuana. This Ordinance does not restrict or prohibit the transportation of marihuana through the Township by (a) a marihuana secure transporter who is licensed to operate in another municipality, or (b) a means otherwise authorized by state law.

## **Section 4.** Violations; Injunctive Relief.

- A. A violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be a nuisance per se. The Township may seek injunctive relief against a violator, in order to abate the violation or to seek such other relief provided by law. In a proceeding for injunctive relief, the violator shall be responsible for all costs, damages, expenses and attorney fees incurred by the Township and shall be subject to all other remedies provided to the Township by law.
- B. A violation of this ordinance is a municipal civil infraction, for which the fines shall not be less than \$100 nor more than \$500, in the discretion of the Court. The foregoing sanctions shall be in addition to the rights of the Township to proceed at law or equity with other appropriate and proper remedies. Additionally, the violator shall pay costs which may include all expenses, direct and indirect, which the Township incurs in connection with the municipal civil infraction.
- C. This ordinance shall be administered and enforced by the Ordinance Enforcement Officer of the Township or by such other person (s) as designated by the Township Board from time to time.
- **Section 4. Severability.** Each portion of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be severable. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional, invalid, or unenforceable, such holding shall not affect the validity or enforceability of this Ordinance as a whole, or of any other part hereof.
- **Section 5. Publication and Effective Date**. This Ordinance shall become effective upon the publication of a summary of its provisions in a local newspaper of general circulation.

# AN ORDINANCE TO COMPLETELY PROHIBIT THE ESTABLISHMENT OR OPERATION OF RECREATIONAL MARIHUANA ESTABLISHMENTS IN THE TOWNSHIP

# **ORDINANCE NO. 20-32019**

**Section 1. Marihuana Facilities/Establishments Prohibited.** The establishment and/or operation of any and all types of a "marihuana establishment," as that term is defined and used in Michigan Initiated Law 1 of 2018, commonly known as the Michigan Regulation and Taxation of Marihuana Act, is prohibited throughout the jurisdictional boundaries of Green Township. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, the following types of marihuana establishments:

## A. All types are listed

- **Section 2. Rights Under MMMA Not Impaired**. This Ordinance does not limit any privileges, rights, immunities or defenses of a person as provided in the Michigan Medical Marihuana Act, Michigan Initiated Law 1 of 2008, MCL 333.26421, *et seq*.
- **Section 3.** Transportation of Marihuana. This Ordinance does not restrict or prohibit the transportation of marihuana through the Township by (a) a marihuana secure transporter who is licensed to operate in another municipality, or (b) a means otherwise authorized by state law.

## **Section 4.** Violations; Injunctive Relief.

- D. A violation of this Ordinance is hereby declared to be a nuisance per se. The Township may seek injunctive relief against a violation and collect all costs.
- E. A violation of this ordinance is a municipal civil infraction, and the township may collect all costs.
- F. This ordinance shall be administered and enforced by the Ordinance Enforcement Officer of the Township or by such other person (s) as designated by the Township Board from time to time.
